



Camp Croix COVID-19 Prevention and Treatment Plan

1. Prevention

- a. Prior to Camper Arrival
 - i. All staff will undergo temperature and symptom checks upon arrival at camp.
 - ii. Staff will be trained on the Camp Croix COVID-19 Prevention and Treatment Plan.
 - iii. Health questionnaires will be sent to all camper families in the week leading up to camp. If a camper answers “yes” to either of the questions, the camper will be asked to stay home. Questions include:
 1. Have you had any of the following symptoms in the last two weeks: fever, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, chills, muscle or body aches, congestion or runny nose, fatigue, headache, sore throat, new loss of taste or smell?
 2. Have you had any contact with someone who tested positive for COVID-19 in the last two weeks?
 - iv. Families will be asked to check temperatures and symptoms of anyone traveling to camp for camper drop-off. If any member of the family has a temperature over 100.4 degrees the morning of camp drop-off, the camper will be asked to stay home. If any member of the family is experiencing symptoms of COVID-19 the morning of camp drop-off, the camper will be asked to stay home.
 - v. We will perform enhanced staff training on health and safety protocols.
 - vi. Signage will be installed around camp to remind campers and staff of protocols, handwashing, and sanitizing.
- b. Camper Drop-off
 - i. Staff will perform temperature and symptom checks on campers and members of the family at arrival, inside the vehicle. If a camper or member of the family has a fever of over 100.4 degrees, the camper will be asked to return home.
 - ii. If any member of the family is experiencing symptoms of COVID-19, the camper will be asked to return home.
 - iii. Only one family at a time will be in a cabin unpacking a camper.
- c. During Camp
 - i. There will be an RN at each week of camp.
 - ii. Staff will perform temperature and symptom checks on campers every morning.
 - iii. Campers will be trained on sanitizing procedures.
 - iv. Sanitizing stations will be setup throughout camp.
 - v. Sanitizing will be increased throughout camp.
 1. Bathrooms will be sanitized morning and evening.

2. Other common areas will be sanitized morning and evening.
3. Recreation equipment will be sanitized after each use.
4. Dining room will be sanitized after each meal.
- vi. Meals will be served outside whenever possible.
- vii. Campers will sleep with head-to-foot alignment to increase distance.
- viii. Campers will use their own personal water bottles the entire week.

2. Treatment

- a. During morning temperature checks, if a camper has a fever over 100.4 degrees, he/she will be promptly be taken for COVID-19 testing (e.g., Shell Lake or Grantsburg) and until then isolated in the sickbay. Note: the choice of medical facility should be chosen based on the speed of getting results (Grantsburg offers results in 15-20 minutes; Shell Lake is working toward this at the time of publication), and distance from Camp Croix.
- b. If a camper shows three or more of the following other COVID-19 symptoms, he/she will also be taken for testing.
 - i. Sore throat
 - ii. Shortness of breath
 - iii. Headache
 - iv. Cough
 - v. Loss of taste or smell
 - vi. Diarrhea
- c. If a camper shows any symptoms related to COVID-19, he/she will be immediately isolated in the sickbay. The following steps will then be taken:
 - i. The nurse will perform an examination to check for other symptoms related to COVID-19.
 - ii. Camper will stay in isolation until symptoms subside.
 - iii. The RN will use his/her discretion to make the determination if the camper should be tested for COVID-19.
- d. If the RN determines that a camper should be tested for COVID-19, the following steps will be taken:
 - i. The camper will be transported in a designated transport vehicle to the local healthcare facility in Shell Lake or Grantsburg to be tested for COVID-19.
 - ii. After testing, the camper will be brought back for isolation in the sickbay until the results of the test come back.
- e. If a camper tests positive for COVID-19, the following steps will be taken:
 - i. All camp activities will be stopped and campers will be isolated in their cabins.
 - ii. All campers' guardians will be notified that a camper has tested positive for COVID-19 and that they need to pick up their children immediately.
 - iii. Staff will sanitize all buildings on the property.
